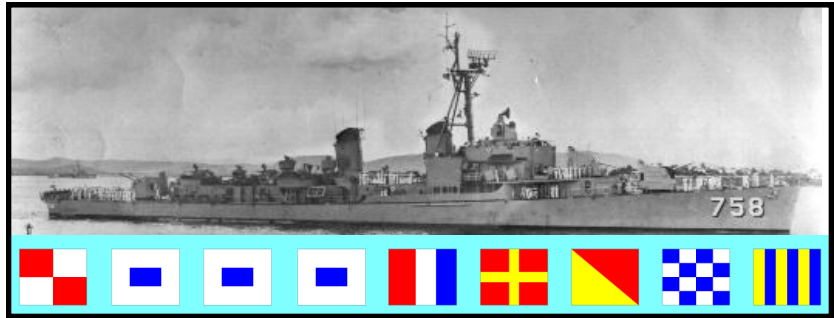

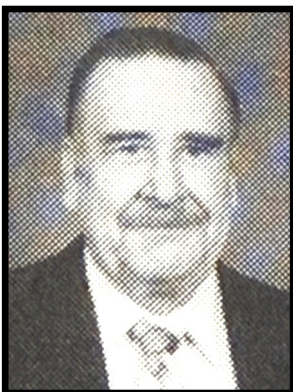

After joining the USS Strong Association, he spent hours, and lots of effort above the call of duty to build and published the website in 1995. Most of you know that last July of 2024, I was finally able to find a home for the memorial plaque of strong DD-467 at the South Pacific WWII Museum on the island of Espiritu Santo, Vanuatu. I thought long and hard about where it needed to go and fortunately most of the family agreed with me.

The experience of being right where the naval supply depot was during the war was something very hard to put into words. The people I met there who helped bring it all together were exceptional, smart, wonderful and made the week I spent on the island an incredible and life changing experience.

The ceremony to install the plaque in the display they built for it was streamed live on Facebook and can be found by visiting the website of the South Pacific WWII Museum. I also wrote about my experience and posted photographs in my July 2024 blog for the Project Uss Strong DD467 website.

This amazing museum is yearning to grow into a world class facility to serve the many thousands of people who visit every year from every corner of the globe. These appear to be the same, but different upper and lower case letters make them separate Facebook pages.

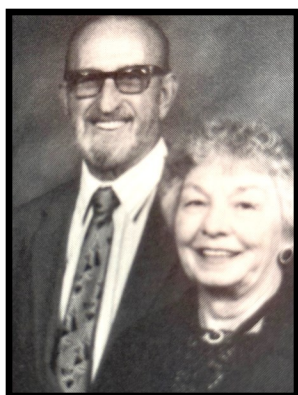

Paul served aboard the USS Strong DD758 from 1958 to 1960, where he was the leading petty officer in ships office, and the captain's writer. By phone calls, letters, and ads in the veteran's magazines, he put together the first reunion in Norfolk VA. in 1987. And with the aid of some of the other members at that time. He founded the USS Strong association. Paul passed away in Feb 2002 and was buried at the Quantico National Cemetery, where the association has erected a flagpole in his honor.

Still Strong

45 years after the fact, destroyer's ranks reunite

The men had not seen one another for 45 years — not since all hell broke loose aboard the destroyer Strong.

At 4:08 a.m. July 5, 1943, the Strong was struck on its port side aft by a Japanese torpedo that exploded with such force it broke the ship in two and sank it.

Signalman Albert Shultz of Independence, Ore.,

was among the Strong crewmen who were saved by the destroyer Chevalier. It was a remarkable rescue.

The Chevalier snuggled up to the Strong's bow so that sailors aboard the stricken ship could scramble to safety in the darkness. In just seven minutes, 241

men escaped from the burning Strong.

Seaman Robert F. Gregory, of Moncks Corner, S.C., could not reach the nets and lines thrown to his shipmates by the Chevalier. He saved himself by leaping into the sea.

Gregory spent 2 1/4 days on a raft shaped like a doughnut before he washed ashore on the island of Kalambajura in the Solomons, where the Strong had been on patrol duty off Guadalcanal. Shipmates Shultz and Gregory did not cross paths until recently, when the Strong's crewmen held a reunion.

Did they recognize each other at once?

They did not.

"It took time to bring him back into focus," Gregory said of Shultz.

A wonderful moment.

His shipmates in the Strong's deck division called Gregory "The Kid" because, well, he was a kid — just 17 when he enlisted. The Kid is a kid no more.

Time is a thief. It steals your life away. Nobody realizes that more than Paul Pritchard of Saddy-Daisy, Tenn., who decided last year that if ever the Strong sailors were to have a reunion, it better be soon.

Attending the reunion in Norfolk were former crewmen from two destroyers named Strong. (When the first Strong was sunk, the Navy gave its name to a destroyer nearing completion at a shipyard in San Francisco.) Both ships helped to conquer the Japanese four decades ago.

Shultz and Gregory represented the first Strong, DD-467. Both were aboard for its commissioning in 1942. Five plankowners — crewmembers when a ship is commissioned — of the second Strong also were honored.

Those who sailed for the Pacific in 1945 aboard DD-758 included Joseph P. Veltre of Washington, Pa., Stan Conley of Turnsville, N.J.; David G. Elg of Millford, Pa.; Joe Sommers of Topeka, Kan.; and Harry L. McCombs Sr. of Niles, Mich.

McCombs is an old salt if there ever was one. He was already a chief petty officer in 1940.

This man is all barnacles.

"The elite of the fleet," he said of the DD-758.

There are ships that have virtually no impact on the men who go to sea aboard them. They are forgotten the minute a sailor leaves the ship with his seabag on his shoulder. Other ships touch the sailors' soul, stay with him.

I have served aboard ships that I loathed. Others, I liked quite a lot, and would welcome a reunion with the men with whom I shared my youth.

Paul assured me that the second Strong was a special ship.

Shultz said the same of the Strong No. 1. He was the ship's first helmsman and its first mail clerk. In civilian life, Shultz was a letter carrier.

Hundreds of men shared duty aboard these destroyers. Virtually all lost touch with one another.

Paul and his wife, Mina, pulled together at least 70 of them for the Norfolk reunion. It was one hell of a good time.
